



Mr. Edward "Chucky" Fondren

November 19, 1952 - February 8, 2024

Edward Charles (Chucky) Fondren Jr., 71, departed this life on February 8, 2024, at his residence. Edward was born on November 19, 1952, in Peoria, IL to Edward and Mary (Munson) Fondren.

Chucky grew up in Taft Homes housing and was drawn to making music at an early age. He was part of this community for many years while sharing his love for performance. Here, he started as leader of one of the most celebrated R&B/Funk bands in Peoria history, the "Ace of Spades." The band's excellence was proven as they won three consecutive titles for best band in Central Illinois Battle of the Bands, held yearly at the Heart of Illinois Fair. After graduating from Spaulding Institute in 1971, to expand his musical scope, he decided to travel. While doing so, Chucky had the opportunity to perform with notables such as Frankie Beverly and Maze, Bootsy Collins, and Lakeside among others.

Chucky accepted Christ and was most recently a member of Bethel Baptist Church where he served as Music Minister under the tutelage of his beloved pastor and friend Rev. Barry Robinson.

He leaves to cherish his memory, two sons Gregory Antione Marcus Rucker and Chuc Rahim Fondren, and one daughter: Salee Jlolyn Taborn, all of Peoria, IL, and one brother and a host of nieces, nephews, and cousins.

Preceding him into the afterlife are both parents, his siblings; Lillian Griffin (Havre de Grace, MD), Barbara Ann Tomas (Bloomington, IL), Sally Bernice Bracey, Priscilla Jeanette Coffey, and Eloise Clark, one nephew; Aaron Scott Fondren and great-nephew; Kendric James Parker, all of Peoria, IL.
