They loved playing together at the parks and going out to eat at their favorite restaurants. In addition, one of the things he loved doing the most was being with his Auntie Bernice. Ny was a great listener, kindhearted, always willing to help, and loved to talk to everyone.

Ny was diagnosed with cancer February of 2021. This was devastating news to him as well as his family & friends. However, because of his faith, Ny knew that God had his back 100%. We remember the moment when Ny was asked by a nurse if he was scared. He replied, "No, I am not scared. I'm ready for whatever God has for me". He was ready to stand up to fight so our immediate and St. Jude's family rallied around him to begin to fight alongside him. He started chemo and radiation 5 days a week while attending school every day. Despite him feeling ill, education was very important to him without complaints. As the treatment began to intensify, he fought even harder. He remained a trooper throughout the fight until God called him home. His famous words were, "Cancer doesn't have me; I have cancer". During our treatment trips to Chicago, he would share laughter, singing and visiting our favorite spots along the way.
